

**VOTING EQUIPMENT
REPORT
NOVEMBER 4, 2014 ELECTION**

In November 2005, the Logan County Board of Elections purchased forty-six (46) M-100 optical scanners with ballot bins and twenty-eight (28) AutoMark marking devices. In July 2007, the Board of Elections purchased four (4) additional M-100 optical scanners and two (2) additional ballot bins. The total inventory of election equipment is fifty (50) M-100 optical scanners, forty-eight (48) ballot bins and twenty-eight (28) AutoMark marking devices.

For the November 4, 2014, general election, the Logan County Board of Elections will be using forty-four (44) of the optical scanners.

The Secretary of State has recommended one (1) optical scanner be assigned for each precinct. The Logan County Board of Elections has assigned one (1) optical scanner to each precinct (representing thirty-seven (37) optical scanners) and four (4) optical scanners have been assigned for absentee voting. Three (3) optical scanners will be used as backup/replacement scanners. Should additional scanners be needed for the backup/replacement, absentee scanners will be pulled and placed where necessary. These assignments meet the recommendations of the Secretary of State.

The Secretary of State has recommended one (1) AutoMark marking device be assigned for each precinct. The Logan County Board of Elections has assigned one (1) AutoMark marking device to each polling location (representing twenty (20) AutoMarks) and one has been assigned for absentee voting. Two (2) Automark marking devices will be used as a backup/replacement device. These assignments are deviations from the recommendations of the Secretary of State. The Logan County Board of Elections has analyzed the use of the AutoMark marking devices from previous elections. Also taken into consideration was the feedback from poll workers as to how many voters actually used the AutoMark on election day. Due to the minimal use of the AutoMark on election day, it is the conclusion of the Board of Elections that it is not necessary to allocate an AutoMark to every precinct and deviates from the Secretary of State's recommendations.

The total number of registered voters in Logan County is 30,310. The attached list of precinct names along with the number of registered voters in each precinct and the voter turnout for a like election (November 2, 2010 Gubernatorial election) for each precinct is as follows:
